Additionally, the U10 girls from our U11 girls team were invited to MD Futsal Statecup, and made it to Semi Finals. They have been invited to the Northeast Regionals.



Rec +/Travel Uniforms

- For the 2018/19 season, Waldorf SC (working with the managers) has opted to go with a Black and White kit
 - Home Black/Black/Black
 - Away Black/White/Black
 - Logo/Number will be Orange
- Why did we do this
 - MLS kit has been discontinued
 - Cost new kits are same quality, while lower in cost
 - Color availability only the cheapest, or most expensive kits were available in Orange
 - Access to replacement uniforms
- What this means for cost
 - Currently uniform kits are \$123(Y)-\$131(A)
 - New complete kits are now going to be \$96(Y)-\$103(A) (2 jerseys, 1 shorts 2 socks, 1 cotton training) (subtract \$13 if no training shirt needed)
- New for 2018/19
 - Returning players will only need to get basic kit without training shirt
 - Most players already have training shirts that are still in good condition
 - New players will be required to purchase the entire kit



Rec +/Travel Uniforms

- For them membership consideration:
 - For the last few years, Waldorf has rolled the cost of uniforms into fees, splitting the cost over two seasons
 - This was something that the membership had voted on and approved as a way of making the purchasing of kits easier
 - Unfortunately the way the system is administered left many people confused
- Options for 2018/19 are:
 - A- Take the uniforms out of Travel fees each member would be responsible for purchasing their own kit
 - B- Keep the basic uniform kit as part of the fees new kit every year. Members responsible for ordering own training shirts

 - Year round training (Winter training indoor at the clubhouse and outdoor at the Fairgrounds*)
 - Light towers for evening training after time changes*
 - Access to Bryantown Mondays/Fridays for additional training*
 - Qualified coaches
 - TeamSnap*
 - Me* (free of charge)

Current Travel/Rec+

- So what?
 - Three teams to Bethesda Premier Cup
 - First Waldorf Team to Jeff Cup
 - Two teams to Northeast Futsal regionals
 - '04 Girls team NCSL D2 (Highest in ever)
 - '05 Boys team (EDP D2) top 20 ranking
 - Two teams invited to Northeast regionals Futsal
 - First Waldorf team to participate in State cup in 5 years



Academy All-Stars

- Developed from the Academy program (Simon French)
- Worked with Academy trainers to identify young players (U8 and below) during the fall session who have already developed a mind/athleticism for the game
- Work with them during the winter season and have them play futsal
- Keep them together for the spring, with a focus on developing the next generation Travel/Rec+ teams

By-Laws Changes

- Change VP of Programs to VP of Travel Programs
 - Responsible for Travel and Rec + programs
- Change VP of Operations to VP of Recreational Programs
 - Responsible for Rec (SMYSL) program
- Move GMM to January timeframe from December.
 - Board Members would then serve from Feb 1 Jan 30.
- To be eligible for nomination for President, members must have 2 or more years service on the Executive Board
 - Ensure continuity and safeguards against "hostile takeover".
